## EC Summer Day Camp

Available: 29 June - 14 August 2009

Ages: 9 - 13 years

What's included: lessons, activity programme, snacks & lunches on activity days

Day Camp provides an ideal supplement to a family holiday. Young students can learn English, and also attend afternoon cultural and recreational activities, 2-3 times per week, in and around Boston.

### A Learning Experience

Students study with other EC students. On the first day of school students will sit a placement test in order to assess their level. They will be placed and join a class with other students who have the same level of English.

Our teachers make the course interesting and fun with lessons planned around topics designed to stimulate young people. They inspire progress and confidence in the use of English. Students participate in active classes where English is practiced through games, role plays, discussions, arts and crafts, exercises, songs, films and surveys.

### The Programme

Students attend morning classes from Monday to Friday. Afternoon cultural and recreational activities are held around Boston. Following the afternoon activity, students will return to join their family. Family members may join in children's afternoon activities for an additional fee.

For families we offer the opportunity to study in the EC Boston's General English courses. These classes meet at the same time as the children's classes.

### Important

It is important that when bookings are made, EC is provided with an email address. This way a student Welcome Pack including information about the school/classes and activity times can be delivered to the student.

### Included

- Maximum 15 students per class
- Supervised activity programme
- Educational resources
- English Course 20 lessons per week (45 minutes each)
- Snack

### New York Trip

Explore the Big Apple on foot, bus and ferry! Students will visit the most important sites in New York including: the Statue of Liberty, Central Park, Times Square, Fifth Avenue and much more. They will also have time to shop and explore the city with their friends.

# Welfare, Rules and Disciplinary Action

## Customer Complaints

At EC, we endeavour to provide our students with the highest possible level of service. If, however, a student is unsatisfied with any aspect of their programme with EC, we ask that they inform us immediately. Most problems are small and can be quickly resolved by our staff members. During the first week of school, all students are given an 'Initial Course Evaluation Form', in which they are asked to evaluate various aspects of their stay, such as tuition, accommodation and leisure. The form also allows students the opportunity to bring to our attention anything that is not to their satisfaction, should they feel unable to speak to us directly. An EC staff member will talk to any student who rates a service as 'poor' or 'not so good' in their Initial Course Evaluation Form. They will try to find a solution as quickly as possible. If the problem cannot be resolved immediately, an official complaint form is filled in and the student's agent will also be informed. A thorough investigation will be carried out. The Initial Course Evaluation Form is given to the students during their first few days at EC so that problems can be solved immediately and not disrupt the remainder of their time with us. There is also an End-of-Course Evaluation Form which gives the students an opportunity to provide EC with general feedback before returning to their home country.

## Signing in/out of children

The parents are responsible to sign in/out their child in the morning (9 am), after classes (by 12:45 pm), and after end of activities. A \$25 fee will apply for every additional 15 minutes when parents are late to check out their child.

## Alcohol Consumption

EC will not tolerate the consumption of alcohol by Junior students. Students who consume alcohol risk being expelled from the school and repatriated to their home country. In America the legal age to drink is 21 and the legal age to buy cigarettes is 18.

## Drugs

The consumption of any illegal drugs will result in the immediate expulsion and repatriation of the student and the possible intervention of the police.

## Expulsion

EC reserves the right to expel and repatriate a student at his/her own expense for any of the following reasons:

- Possession of any illegal drugs
- Drinking of alcohol
- Malicious damage to school property or place of accommodation
- If the student is a danger to his/her own safety or that of other students
- Breaking American law
- Repeated failure to attend academic lessons
- Violation of any EC School rules.

In any of the above circumstances the student is informed that their stay is going to be terminated with immediate effect. Simultaneously EC informs the student's agent and/or the parents of the student's behaviour and the course of action to be taken. An EC staff member ensure the students are safely collected by their parents. Following such action EC will terminate all relationships with the student and will be unable to take further responsibility for the student. No refunds will be given to any students who have been expelled.
